Bordering on California, Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, and Nevada, Arizona, known as the "Grand Canyon State" encompasses a wide range of influences geographically, culturally and politically.

Phoenix, one of Arizona's two largest cities, certainly has a distinct charm of it's own. Phoenix and its more than 20 surrounding communities are known as the "Valley of the Sun", an alias clearly linked to Arizona's climate and blisteringly hot growth over the last several years.

During the real estate boom years of 2003 to 2006, Phoenix was one of the up-and-coming cities in the Southwest region. During the periods of 2000 and 2010, Phoenix experienced a 24 percent population increase, growing from 1.3 million to more than 1.6 million, making it the second fastest growing metropolitan area in the country, after Las Vegas. Thanks to the nation's ongoing economic recovery, the Phoenix median home price has increased in value yet remains very affordable, offering a wide range of living preferences from luxurious downtown condos, elegant old homes, modern showplaces to friendly countryside ranches. No matter where you decide to live in the "Valley of the Sun", you'll find a friendly neighborhood atmosphere waiting for you!

The Phoenix metropolitan area includes the city of Phoenix, Maricopa County, most of Pinal County and parts of Southern Yavapai County. The city's combined metropolitan statistical area population is just over four million and it includes the communities located in Maricopa County; Anthem,

Avondale, Buckeye, Carefree, Cave Creek, Chandler, El Mirage, Fountain Hills, Gila Bend, Gilbert, Glendale, Goodyear, Guadalupe, Litchfield Park, Mesa, Paradise Valley, Peoria, Queen Creek, Scottsdale, Sun City, Sun City West, Sun Lakes, Surprise, Tempe, Tolleson, Tonopah, Wickenburg, and Youngtown. The communities located in Pinal County include; Apache Junction, Arizona City, Casa Grande, Coolidge, Eloy, Florence, Kearny, Mammoth, Maricopa, Oracle, Picacho, Picacho Peak, Red Rock, San Manuel, and Superior.

LOCATION:

Phoenix is the capital of Arizona and has the official elevation of 1,117 feet above sea level. Phoenix is 372 miles east of Los Angeles, 297 miles southeast of Las Vegas, and 821 miles south of Denver.

NEWCOMER INFORMATION



Driver's License

As a new resident to Arizona, you are required to obtain an Arizona driver license and to register your vehicle(s) in this state.

If you've just moved to Arizona, or you've never been licensed to drive before, you'll need to get an AZ driver's license right away to begin driving legally in the state.

To complete your new driver's license application process:

Submit your completed license application and surrender your out-of-state license, if you're a new resident.

Present proof of ID, age, and legal presence in AZ:

You'll need a minimum of two documents from the full list of accepted documents (birth certificate, U.S. passport, I-94, Social Security card); one document must include a clear photo of you.

At least one document must be from the Primary column.

If you don't have a photo document, you'll need three documents from the list, all of which must be originals or certified copies.

Provide proof of name change, if applicable and provide your Social Security number.

Pass a vision exam and the written knowledge test (unless exempt).

If you hold a permit, you will not need to take the permit test.

New residents generally do not have to take this exam.

Pass the driving test (unless exempt).

New residents generally do not have to take the driving test.

Pay the applicable fee.

Once you complete these steps, you'll be given your permanent license right away, UNLESS your local office cannot issue them (this generally applies to very small towns and cities).

If you do not receive your permanent driver's license immediately, you'll get a temporary license to use while your permanent is being mailed to you.

Your license will expire upon turning 65 years old; however, you'll need to get an updated photo and vision exam every 12 years.

Applicants age 60 years old or older will get a license valid for 5 years.

Insurance



Requirements

Arizona requires that every motor vehicle operated on roadways be covered by one of the statutory forms of financial responsibility, more commonly called liability insurance, through a company that is authorized to do business in Arizona.

This requirement also includes golf carts, motorcycles and mopeds.

Minimum levels of financial responsibility are:

- \$15,000 bodily-injury liability for one person and \$30,000 for two or more people.
- \$10,000 property-damage liability.

Vehicle Registration/Tags

Vehicle registration in Arizona MUST be completed in person at your local DMV office. You will need to submit your vehicle title, a completed application form, and proof of ID, as well as pay the required fee. You can obtain a temporary registration if you need extra time to gather your vehicle paperwork in order to register it. If you live in Phoenix or Tucson, you will also be required to pass an emissions test.

Pets



Thousands of pets find their way into our shelters every year. A majority of these animals have no form of identification and are never reunited with their families. Licensing your dog is not only the law, it helps ensure that your beloved pet will be returned home safely.

In Maricopa County, all dogs three months of age and older are required to have a license and rabies vaccination. If your licensed dog is picked up by one of our Animal Control Officers, we will make every attempt to bring your dog home to you immediately, and save you (and your dog) a trip to the shelter. Cats do not need to be licensed.

If your dog does arrive at MCACC and has a current license, his first 24 hours at the shelter will be at no charge. Licensed dogs receive longer care periods while our staff exhausts every option to contact you.

Additionally, if a licensed dog bites someone, he may be eligible for home quarantine instead of being quarantined in our facility or a veterinary hospital.

Most Popular Destinations

The Grand Canyon

The Grand Canyon is easily Arizona's most distinguishable landmark and a natural wonder that you simply have to see to believe! Stretching 277 miles from end to end, steep, rocky walls descend more than a mile to the canyon's floor.

Monument Valley

One of the grandest and most photographed landmarks in the United States, Monument Valley Navajo Tribal Park is a sprawling, sandy preserve that spans the border between Arizona and Utah, bathing the region in rich red hues.

Four Corners

Stand in four states at one time at Four Corners Monument! Unique amongst Arizona's many landmarks, Four Corners Monument is the only place in the United States where four states intersect at one point: **Arizona, New Mexico, Utah and Colorado.**

Petrified Forest

Experience one of the world's **largest and most vibrantly colored assemblies of petrified wood,** historic structures and archeological sites at Petrified Forest National Park, located east of Winslow, Arizona.

Painted Desert



Arizona TAXES

Business Tax

Businesses are required to report and pay Phoenix privilege sales tax on their taxable business activity on a monthly, quarterly, or annual basis. Reporting frequency is **based upon taxable gross income.** You may request a change in filing frequency after you have established a minimum of six months of reporting history. All new accounts must file monthly for a minimum of six months prior to requesting a change in filing frequency

Automobile Registration Fees

The state also charges a vehicle license tax (VLT) at every registration and renewal. This tax is assessed for each \$100 of your vehicle's value. Note that the value of your vehicle is calculated as 60% of the original manufacturer's retail price, and that total will be lowered by 16.25% at every registration renewal.

For each \$100 of the vehicle's value, you will be assessed:

New vehicles: \$2.80 Used vehicles: \$2.89

Alternative Fuel Vehicle: \$4

Government Services Tax

This tax is in lieu of personal property tax. The valuation of the vehicle is determined at 35% of the manufacturer's suggested retail price, without accessories. Vehicle value is depreciated to 85% after the first year and graduated down to five percent after nine years. Buses,

trucks and truck trailers depreciate down to 75% after the first year and down 13% after 10 years. The rate imposed by the state is four cents on each \$1 valuation. Counties may levy up to one cent on each dollar of valuation, but the total tax imposed cannot exceed five cents on each dollar of valuation.

Child Care

Businesses that provide on-site child care or vouchers for child care to employees are eligible for an abatement of up to 50 percent on the business tax. **Eligible employees** cannot earn more than 150 percent of the federal poverty level.

Real Property

(Land, buildings and improvements not normally removable) The taxable value for land is full cash value. The value for improvements is replacement costs less depreciation at 1.5 percent per year up to 50 years.

Sales and Use

The Arizona sales tax rate is currently 5.6%. In Arizona, each county, city and special district can add sales taxes on top of the state rate. Taxes in Arizona are origin-based, meaning the sales tax rate is based, or determined from, the location where a sale originates. The Arizona state use tax rate is not the same as the state, county, city and special district sales tax rates. If you reside in AZ, use tax is due to the state on any and all transactions where sales tax has not been paid, even out-of-state internet sales.

The Phoenix Metro Light Rail was approved by voters in Phoenix in 2000. Transit 2000 aimed at improving the local bus service (considered unacceptably inadequate compared to other major US cities) and the formation of bus rapid transit and light rail, among other things, which was seen as a more affordable approach. It used the route placing and color designations from the 1989 plan.

Construction on a new light rail line began in March, 2005. Featuring 28 stations on the initial 20-mile starter segment. The line celebrated its grand opening December 27, 2008, with official ribbon-cutting ceremonies and community celebrations spread throughout Phoenix, Tempe, and Mesa.

The event was attended by thousands of local residents who waited as long as an hour or more to ride the vehicles. The stations have been designed to complement their immediate surroundings.

As of early 2014, income has exceeded Metro's stated goal with 44.6% fare box recovery, partially due to the light rail ridership far exceeding original projections. The light rail has also led to rapid urban development in downtown Phoenix and Tempe, generating additional revenue through taxes. Valley Metro had its busiest month in February 2014, with a weekday ridership of 48,924.

Deer Valley Municipal Airport was built in 1960 as a private airfield with a single runway. In 1971, the City of Phoenix purchased the 482-acre site. In 1975, a new terminal was constructed and the FAA began directing air traffic. Later, the FAA replaced Deer Valley's four hardworking radio operators with 26 air traffic controllers. The airport also became home to the Phoenix Police Department which utilizes a 12,000 sq. ft. hangar for their citywide helicopter operations. In 2007, the FAA completed construction of a state-of-theart air traffic control tower on the north side of the airport and the airport is in the process of rehabilitating most of the pavement on the south and northwest areas, at a cost of over 17 million dollars. The City Council adopted a revised Master Plan in 2007, which called for a balanced approach to accommodate all customers of the airport, including potential development of corporate hangers on the southeast side of the airport.

The City of Phoenix bought and began operating Phoenix Goodyear Airport in July, 1968. Prior to that, the airport was built and operated by the United States Navy. The airport is classified as a general aviation reliever airport for Sky Harbor. With one of the best general aviation runways in the country, Phoenix Goodyear Airport is poised to continue providing quality aeronautical services to our tenants. Phoenix Goodyear Airport is 2.2 miles south of Interstate 10 on Litchfield Road.

Scottsdale Airport was founded in June 22, 1942, as Thunderbird Field II, a basic training facility for World War Il Army Air Corps pilots. The City of Scottsdale acquired the airfield portion of the academy's property in 1966. The first fixed base operator was selected in April of 1967, and the first business jets landed at Scottsdale Airport in the following August. In 2004, there were over 450 aircraft based at Scottsdale Airport, from single-engine recreational planes to numerous corporate jets. Approximately 200,000 take offs and landings occurred, making Scottsdale the second busiest single runway airport in the country, and the busiest corporate jet facility in the state. Scottsdale Airport plays a key role in linking the Scottsdale economy to the Southeast and the nation.


Located just five miles west of downtown Glendale, five miles east of Luke Air Force Base, and 30 minutes northwest of downtown Phoenix, this 477-acre modern airport features a beautifully designed two-story, 18,000 square-foot terminal, a Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) controlled tower, and complete airport services for general aviation and corporate jet traffic.

Phoenix-Mesa Gateway Airport

The former "Williams Air Force Base" played a strategic role in America's aviation history. Gearing up for the combat pilot demands of World War II, the Army Air Corps broke ground in Southeast Mesa, Arizona for its Advanced Flying School on July 16, 1941. In January of 1948, the facility was re-designated as Williams Air Force Base. In 1993 the Base was closed and reopened a vear later as Williams Gateway Airport. Over a decade later the name was changed again to Phoenix-Mesa Gateway Airport. Today, Gateway hosts more than 40 companies, serves more than 35 cities with non-stop service via Allegiant, and contributes \$1.3 billion annually to the Arizona economy.

LUKE AIR FORCE BASE

Luke Air Force Base is an active-duty, F-16 Fighting Falcon training base with 170 F-16s assigned. The base population includes about 7,500 military members and 15,000 family members. An important part of Luke's F-16 fighter pilot training mission is the Barry M. Goldwater Air Force Range. The range consists of 1,900,000 acres of relatively undisturbed Sonoran Desert. This training range is located southwest of Luke Air Force Base between Yuma and Tucson, south of Interstate 8. With 57,000 cubic miles of airspace where pilots practice air-to-air maneuvers and engage simulated battlefield targets on the ground, it is one important training ground for F-16 pilots. The immense complex allows for simultaneous training activities on nine air-to-ground and two

air-to-air ranges. In addition to flying and maintaining the F-16, Luke airmen also deploy to support on-going operations in Iraq, Afghanistan and to combatant commanders in other locations around the world. In 2004, more than 900 Luke airmen were deployed, most to supporting Operation Iraqi Freedom. Since June 2012, Luke AFB has been the permanent home of Naval Operational Support Center (NOSC) Phoenix of the US Navy. A NOSC is a facility used to provide operational support for training and administrative services to Navy Reserve Units. NOSC Phoenix supports over 750 Navy Reservists in 16 Navy Reserve units. The new 32,055 square-foot, one-story facility is located on a 1.85 acre site at Luke AFB. The new complex features sufficient parking and a secured perimeter to meet current anti-terrorism and force protection standards. On site administrative staff, a medical unit, and reservists are on call during drill weekends. It also has a 4,800 square-foot drill hall, command staff offices, reserve unit administration spaces, medical and dental examination areas, six classrooms, a distance learning center, a physical fitness room.

NATIONAL MEMORIAL CEMETERY OF AZ

A state law was passed in 1976 and signed by Governor Raul Castro authorizing the development of a state veterans cemetery. The cemetery was dedicated December 9, 1978 and the first burial occurred on March 19, 1979. The cemetery was officially transferred to the VA on April 1, 1989. The cemetery consists of 225 acres and will not reach capacity until well after the year 2030. The Department of Veterans Affairs spent over \$13 million for improvements in 1999. The project included three new committal shelters, a maintenance building, visitor center, founders plaza, assembly area and extensive landscaping.
